Purpose:

For Lamont County Council to consider designating the Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of St. John, of Andrew Alberta as a Municipal Historic Resource.

Background Information:

On July 7, 2020, Darcy Frunchak contacted Lamont County requesting an opportunity for the St. John Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church to present to Council in the form of a delegation. The delegation was delayed for various reasons, including restrictions put in place due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Darcy Frunchak presented to Council at the January 12, 2021 Special Council Meeting and Council received the presentation as information.

At the September 14, 2021 Regular Council Meeting, Administration brought the request back to Council and was directed to prepare a formal bylaw and bring it back to the October 12,

2021 Regular Council Meeting. Unfortunately the October 12, 2021 deadline was missed by Administration.

Strategic Alignment:

Goal #6: We are committed to genuine relationships

Financial Impact:

None at this time.

If the Bylaw is passed by Lamont County Council, the Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of St. John, of Andrew would then be qualified for an annual grant of \$500 pursuant to the Historic Resource Designation Incentives Policy 4153.

Previous Council / Committee Directions:

The Lamont County Council made the following resolutions at the September 14, 2021, Regular Council Meeting:

"**THAT** Lamont County Council direct administration to prepare a formal bylaw and bring back to the next Regular Council Meeting on October 12, 2021, for the first reading with respect to Municipal Designation of St. John Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church."

Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of St. John, of Andrew Municipal Historic Resource

BEING A BYLAW OF LAMONT COUNTY IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA TO DESIGNATE THE SITE KNOWN AS THE UKRAINIAN GREEK ORTHODOX CHURCH OF ST. JOHN, OF ANDREW AS A MUNICIPAL HISTORIC RESOURCE.

WHEREAS, the Section 26 of the *Historical Resources Act*, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, C. H-9 as amended, permits Council to designate any historic resource within Lamont County whose preservation Council considers to be in the public interest, together with any land in or on which it is located, as a Municipal Historic Resource; and

WHEREAS, the preservation of the of the Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of St. John, of Andrew in Lamont County is deemed to be in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, the owners of the Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of St. John, of Andrew have agreed to waive compensation now and in the future.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of Lamont County in the Province of Alberta duly assembled; hereby enacts as follows:

1. The Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of St. John, of Andrew, located on land legally described as:

**ALL THAT PORTION OF THE NORTH EAST QUARTER OF SECTION EIGHT (8)
TOWNSHIP FIFTY SIX (56)
RANGE SIXTEEN (16)
WEST OF THE FOURTH MERIDIAN
DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:- COMMENCING AT A POINT ON THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY
OF THE SAID QUARTER SECTION THREE HUNDRED AND SIXTY ONE AND FOUR
TENTHS (361.4) FEET SOUTHERLY FROM THE NORTH EAST CORNER THEREOF
THENCE WESTERLY AND PARALLEL TO THE NORTHERLY BOUNDARY OF SAID
QUARTER SECTION A DISTANCE OF THREE HUNDRED AND SIXTY ONE AND FOUR
TENTHS (361.4) FEET THENCE SOUTHERLY AND PARALLEL TO THE SAID
EASTERLY BOUNDARY A DISTANCE OF TWO HUNDRED AND FORTY ONE AND
SIX HUNDREDTHS (241.06) FEET TO A POINT THENCE EASTERLY AND
PARALLEL TO THE SAID NORTHERLY BOUNDARY A DISTANCE OF THREE
HUNDRED AND SIXTY ONE AND FOUR TENTHS (361.4) FEET MORE OR LESS
TO A POINT ON SAID EASTERLY BOUNDARY THENCE NORTHERLY ALONG SAID
EASTERLY BOUNDARY A DISTANCE OF TWO HUNDRED AND FORTY ONE AND
SIX HUNDREDTHS (241.06) FEET MORE OR LESS TO THE POINT OF
COMMENCEMENT CONTAINING 0.809 HECTARES (2.0 ACRES) MORE OR LESS
EXCEPTING THEREOUT: 0.074 HECTARES (0.18 ACRES) MORE OR LESS
AS SHOWN ON ROAD PLAN 822 0084
EXCEPTING THEREOUT ALL MINES AND MINERALS
AND THE RIGHT TO WORK THE SAME**

In Lamont County, is hereby designated as a Municipal Historic Resource.

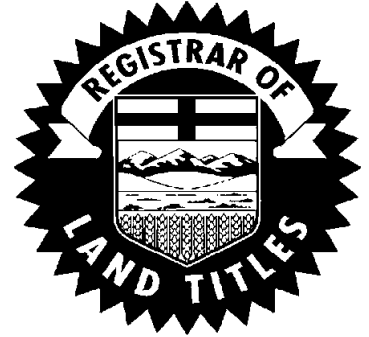

- PROCEDURE:** :
1. Prior to passage of a bylaw designating a property/site as a Municipal Historic Resource, the property/site owner shall:
 - a) Pursuant to Sec. 28 (1) of the Historical Resources Act, sign a waiver of any rights to compensation from the County due to real or perceived decrease in economic value of the building, structure or land that is within the area to be designated by the bylaw.
 - c) Agree, in written form, to an incentive offered by the County to encourage designation, or may decline, in written form, to receive any incentive.
 2. The incentive(s) offered by the County shall be as follows:
 - a) An annual grant of \$500 for not-for-profit and charitable organizations (this would include churches, community halls, etc)

- b) An annual grant of \$250 for rural commercial properties, which would include any accessory buildings included in the designation
 - c) An annual grant of \$250 for farm sites where the farmhouse and/or more than one farm building/structure is designated
 - c) An annual grant of \$100 for farm sites where a single building is designated
3. Incentive grant payments shall commence in the year following designation. They shall be distributed on or around January 1 of each year and shall be made payable to:
- a) owners of private buildings/farmsites;
 - b) the local parish/governing board for a charitable/non-profit structure.

Staff have committed to providing periodic update to Council on the volume, nature and status of Service Requests. The information provided in this report is from January 1, 2021 to November 8, 2021.

An initial report was shared with Council on September 28, 2021 for service requests during 2021 up to and including September 24th.

The year to date tracking of service requests indicates an improvement in overall county-wide completion rates from 84% to 86%. Improvements were seen in all categories with the exception of Drainage (decline from 64% to 56% completion) and Miscellaneous (marginal decline from 99% to 96%)

In the fullness of time we hope to report on the source of Service Requests, namely via a Councillor; a phone call from resident; the servicerequests@lamontcounty.ca email address of the website button.
