
Seasonal Labourer/Scale Operator, Public Works (Seasonal)

Lamont County is seeking experienced and highly motivated individuals to join our team. We are looking for a **Seasonal Labourer/Scale Operator** in the Public Works department. This position reports directly to the Operations Supervisor and performs a variety of labour-intensive tasks for the 2023 road maintenance season. Preference will be given to candidates who have scale operating/checking experience.

JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Taking weights of gravel trucks, providing scales tickets for drivers, recording weights on spreadsheet, ensuring trucks are not overweight before leaving gravel pit.
- Manual tasks of all types in all operations (cleaning and steaming culvert ends, patching, pothole repairs, signage, guard rails, flagging, garbage and tree clean up, etc.).
- Operates a County vehicle and light equipment including small tractors, trailers, etc.
- Compliance with the Lamont County health and safety program.
- Accurate recording and submission of weekly timesheets.
- Other labour related duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS:

- Experience in labour work and light equipment operation.
- Experience with computers and Microsoft Excel.
- High School Diploma or GED.
- Holds a Class 5 Alberta Driver's license.
- Able to lift approximately 50 lbs, sit for prolonged periods, climb in and out of equipment.
- Able to work in all types of weather (rain, cold or hot) and dusty conditions.
- Willing to work 10-hour days – overtime may be required from time-to-time.
- Safety conscious and attentive to the working environment they are in.
- Excellent communication and experience interacting with the public is required.
- Ability to work independently and unsupervised.

Lamont County is committed to protecting the health and safety of its employees, all personnel are governed by the County's Health & Safety Program. This position is identified as a safety sensitive role and requires the following pre-screening conditions:
